MARYLAND COTTAGE, CHURCH LANE, HALLOW GREEN. Grid Ref: 8282 5808

Maryland Cottage is of brick construction with dark weatherboarding, adding to the variety of the area. Its steep roof and dormer windows are redolent of the Arts and Crafts movement.







The cottage at the left of the picture (Rose Cottage) was sold in 1905. It was demolished in the early part of the twentieth century and the land that it occupied now forms part of the gardens of the current Maryland Cottages.

1477 - The original cottage formed part of a collection of parcels of land and various buildings recorded at that time

1935 - Maryland Cottage became two separate dwellings, linked by a first floor level bridge. There is a foundation stone in the archway between the houses commemorating the building of the second dwelling. It is of brick construction with dark weatherboarding, adding to the variety of the area.
